Three Main Jewish Festivals

The Passover and Unleavened Bread

The Passover

- 1. Commemorates Israel's deliverance from Egypt
- 2. The slain lamb's blood is to be sprinkled on the doorpost and lintel
- 3. Typical of Christ's crucifixion

Unleavened Bread

- 1. Commemorate the hardships of fleeing Egypt
- 2. Offerings consisted of a wave-offering of barley (the firstfruits) and burnt offerings
- 3. Only unleavened bread was to be eaten during the week

Pentecost of the Feast of Weeks

- 1. Commemorates the coming harvest
- 2. Offerings consist of grain and burnt offerings
- 3. Symbolized the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost

Feast of Tabernacles of Booths

- 1. Commemorates the wilderness wanderings and the completion of the harvest
- 2. Offerings consisted of burnt offerings and a sin offering
- 3. The people were to live in booths for the week
- 4. Typical picture was the coming Millennial kingdom
